

THE COST OF HAVING YOUR OWN BABY

Take a Reasonable Risk

To take a risk is to expose yourself to danger... or failure... or rejection. Taking a risk can also expose you to:

- A new experience
- A new friend
- A new skill
- A new idea
- A new achievement

Most people tend to back off at the ideas of risktaking. However, if you don't take some reasonable risks, you are stunting your growth as an individual. If you chance nothing, you are probably a bored (or borig) person.

Reasonable Risks

A reasonable risk is putting yourself in a situation where you stand to gain something positive if you take a chance and succeed.

For example: suppose you see someone whom you would like to know better, to be spending some time with, to be welcomed into his/her circle of friends.

 If you don't risk being rejected, you'll never get accepted.

The following are some Reasonable Risks:

- Risk talking to someone new.
- Risk buying a tape by a musician you've never heard of before.
- Risk taking lessons to learn a new skill or sport.

WHY DO THESE TEENS RISK PREGNANCY?

OBJECTIVE:

To create an awareness of reasons and choices that influence such risky behavior as participating in sexual activities which can lead to unwanted pregnancies.

Cut out the choices given on the master sheet into separate cards or let the students cut their own.



OBJECTIVE:

To recognize difficult situations that require decision-making skills.

We all come across situations and choices that could change our lives. how we deal with these choices, may help or hurt you & others around you.

WHY WOULD YOU SAY NO?

- If the risk could endanger your life or health
- IF IT IS NOT LEGAL
- IF IT IS AGAINST YOUR FAMILY'S BELIEFS AND RULES
- If it causes a lack of respect to you or others

WHAT WOULD YOU SAY OR DO IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES?

(Demonstrate using techniques, other than abuse, that you think would work or has worked for you).

- Your first steady boyfriend or girlfriend has been pressuring you into having sex by saying ... "if you really love me you'll prove it!".
- YOUR BOYFRIEND OR GIRLFRIEND HAS BEEN PRESSURING YOU TO HAVE SEX BY SAYING... "YOU WANT SEX AS MUCH AS I DO!".

 Your boyfriend or girlfriend says... "let's try it once - nobody gets pregnant the first time".

Do not let your friends intimidate or pressure youinto doing something (taking a risk) that you may regret. Show them that you respect yourself by saying NO.

- Say "no" and explain your reason. Don't be ashamed if you or your family have set up rules. Even if they don't show it, others will respect you more for being strong in your convictions.
- Say "no" and suggest a different activity or behavior that is less risky and more responsible.

- let the person know that you want to remain friends, but refuse to participate in certain activities
- agree in part. (ie. "i'd like to go to your house, but only if your parents are home. ")
- stay away from risky situations or just leave.

If you realize that you participate in risky behavior re-evaluate your actions & change them

SAYING kNOw TECHNIQUE

1. When you are talking to someone, look the person in the eye.

2. Show confidence in yourself by standing straight.



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- 3. Talk calmly and clearly.
- 4. Make a SANDWICH
- Say something positive,
- Give a negative message
- Suggest positive alternative.

EXAMPLE: "I really like you, but I don't want to have sex, let's go to a movie or the mall instead!"

5. If you're still being pressured, use the BROKEN RECORD' TECHNIQUE:

SAY #4 OVER AGAIN

6. If someone is still pressuring you, state your decision STRONGLY, refuse to argue, and walk away.

ABSITENCE

MEANS NO SEXUAL INTERCOURSE

- There is no worry
- There are no side effects
- It is 100% effective
- There are no conflicts with parents

If you have been sexually active in the past, you can always choose to abstain in the present or future.

ABSTINENCE REQUIRES DISCIPLINE AND CONTROL.

There are many advantages to remaining abstlnent:

- Freedom from loss of self-esteem
- Freedom from loss of reputation

- Freedom from sexuall v transmitted diseases

WHAT IS BIRTH CONTROL?

Female Reproductive Organs

A WOMAN GETS PREGNANT WHEN:

- 1. She has sex with a man.
- 2. Her egg is fertilized by the man's sperm.
- 3. The fertilized egg attaches to the lining of her uterus.


BIRTH CONTROL means keeping the egg and the sperm from getting together or preventing the fertilized egg from attaching to the lining of the uterus. Some birth control methods are better than others.

WHO SHOULD USE BIRTH CONTROL?

Anyone who has sex or who plans to have sex and does not want a pregnancy. Your primary care doctor will help you decide what is the best method for you.

THE PILL

The pill The ovary does not release an egg. Even though the sperm enter the uterus and tubes there is no egg for them to fertilize



ONE A DAY: Pills are 99% effective if taken EVERY DAY at about the same time. DON'T MISS ONE!

HOW PILLS WORK:

Birth control pills prevent ovaries from releasing eggs. If eggs aren't released, a woman can't get pregnant even when sperm are present.

HOW TO GET THE PILL:

You must go to your doctor for an exam. The doctor must make sure you don't have cancer, infections, high blood pressure, sexually transmitted diseases or other problems that would make the pill wrong for you.

WARNING:

If you take the pill, you must see your doctor for an exam once every year. Call your doctor if you have:

- 1. Severe head, chest or leg pains 4. Blurred vision
- 2. Excessive irregular bleeding 5. Mental depression
- 3. Extreme weakness


Side effects are rare, but they are real when they happen.

<u>Condom</u>: A thin, strong rubber cover which the man rolls onto his penis. It catches his sperm and keeps them from entering the woman's vagina and fertilizing an egg. Condoms can be bought either lubricated or not lubricated, with or without a reservoir tip. If the condom does not have a tip, the man should leave a little space at the end when he puts it on.



Applicator is filled from a tube of gel or can of foam



Penis Urethra

FOAM (or gel): A chemical which kills sperm. It is supplied in a package with a plastic tube. Before sex, a woman fills the tube with foam and puts it in her vagina as far back as it will go.

ONE IS GOOD – TWO IS BETTER!

Two tubes of foam or gel give more protection than one. Insert up to 30 minutes before sex. **DO NOT DOUCHE** for at least 8 hours after sex. You must use **EVERY TIME** you have sex.

Foam or gel is about 80% effective in preventing pregnancy. Foam AND a condom used together are 95 - 100% effective when used correctly.

Your doctor can give you a prescription for foam and condoms, but you can buy both at any drug store.

If lubrication is needed, use water-based types. DO NOT USE petroleum jelly, cold cream or other oils – they may damage the condom.


DIAPHRAGM and CONTRACEPTIVE CREAM or JELLY

DIAPHRAGM: A round rubber cap that covers the opening to the uterus and prevents the sperm from getting in. A woman coats the edges and inside of the diaphragm with contraceptive cream or jelly and puts it in her vagina before sex. The creams and jellies contain chemicals that kill sperm for more protection. The diaphragm is not likely to be felt by the man or woman during sex.


DO NOT TAKE THE DIAPHRAGM OUT of the vagina for at least 8 hours after sex and do not douche.

YOUR DOCTOR must measure you to get the right size diaphragm. Your doctor will show you how to put it in and take it out. He will give you a prescription for the contraceptive cream or jelly.

Diaphragms used with cream or jelly are about 90% effective.



Diaphragm & contraceptive cream or jelly is a barrier to the sperm which doesn't allow them to enter the uterus and tubes and fertilize the egg.





WHAT IS NORPLANT?

It is 6 hollow capsules, 2 inches long each, that hold hormones like birth control pills. The capsules are placed under the skin of a woman's upper arm through a tiny incision.

WHY IS IT GOOD?

It doesn't change liver function, sugar metabolism, blood clotting factors, blood pressure or body weight.

May possibly reduce risks for pelvic infection and cancer of the uterus.

DISADVANTAGES

Menstrual periods may not 1. See your primary care be regular and you have more bleeding and spotting each month.

You are more likely to develop cysts of the ovary, but these usually resolve themselves without any treatment or surgery.

YOU MUST:

doctor

2. Take pills or shots of progesterone for 3 months. (These are the same hormones that are in Norplant)

3. Be willing to keep the Norplant for at least 4 years.

4. Be able to live with the irregular. prolonged menstrual periods that Norplant can cause.

TUBAL LIGATION (Sterilization)

FEMALE SURGICAL METHODS

WHAT IS A TUBAL LIGATION? It is an


operation that the doctor does by cutting and tying the tubes that the eggs pass through each month. The man's sperm can no longer reach the egg to form a baby.

CAN TUBES BE PUT BACK TOGETHER?


No, this is a permanent method of birth control for women who are sure they do not want any more children.

WILL A WOMAN'S SEX LIFE CHANGE?

No. It may even be better without the worry of a pregnancy being caused. Nothing is taken out - menstrual periods still occur - sex can be enjoyed.



VASECTOMY (Sterilization)



MALE SURGICAL METHODS

WHAT IS A VASECTOMY? It is a simple operation that takes 20 to 30 minutes and makes a man unable to father children.

WHAT IS DONE? The two tiny tubes that carry sperm from the testes are cut. Sperm are still produced, but are absorbed into the man's body.

DOES VASECTOMY MEAN CASTRATION ?

NO! Castration removes the testes - vasectomy does not touch the testes.

WILL A MAN'S SEX LIFE CHANGE AFTER

VASECTOMY? It can be better since it removes the worry of getting a woman pregnant! Ejaculations will still happen and fluid will still come out, but no sperm will be there.

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TEEN PREGNANCY: CHILDREN HAVING CHILDREN

OTHER BIRTH CONTROL POSSIBILITIES

1. DEPO-PROVERA: A new way to prevent pregnancy. You must get a shot (injection) every 3 months from your doctor. There may be some changes in your periods, so ask your doctor to tell you more about this method if you are interested.

2. CERVICAL CAP: This is a cup-shaped device that looks like a tiny diaphragm. It is 85-90% effective if properly fitted.

3. CONTRACEPTIVE SPONGE: This is a small sponge that contains sperm-killing chemicals. It must be wet with water and put into the vagina before sex. It works for 24 hours. It is thrown away after sex. It does NOT protect you against disease and can cause irritation and problems if not used correctly. It is NOT as effective as other methods or combinations of methods.

4. I.U.D. (INTRAUTERINE DEVICE): This is a small plastic device that a doctor puts inside the uterus to prevent pregnancy.

The methods at birth control listed below are NOT VERY Effective, but are better than nothing. Don't count on them to prevent pregnancy. 1. RHYTHM (the "SAFE" days): "Safe" days are thought to be just before and just after a menstrual period. Unsafe days are halfway between one period and the next - when an egg is released. Safe days are not the same for everyone, they're unpredictable. so it is easy to get pregnant.

2. BREAST FEEDING: You CAN get pregnant when you're breast feeding even before you start having periods again.

3. VAGINAL FOAMING TABLETS. CREAMS, JELLIES: These are cheap and easy to use. but not very effective. Creams and jellies used with a diaphragm or condom (or both) are more protective.


4. VAGINAL SUPPOSITORIES: This is a cone-shaped waxy material that has a spermkilling chemical in it. Must be put in vagina 15 minutes before sex. These are not very effective, but they're better than nothing

5. WITHDRAWAL: This is when a man takes his penis out of the woman before the fluid (semen) comes. It only takes one drop to cause pregnancy! Use only if there is nothing else available.

6. DOUCHE: Cleaning the man's fluid (semen) out right after sex does little good. The sperm can already be in the uterus and can't be reached.

HOW RU-486 WORKS

The Franch abortion pill, RU-486, has been used by more than 150,000 women in France, Britain and Sweden to terminate pregnancies. Many who advocate the drug as an alternative to surgical abortion hope the drug will be made available to American women following clinical testing in this country.



CONDOMS

- A latex condom is a sheath of latex rubber, which may or may not be lubricated.
- IT must be placed over the erect penis before sexual activity begins. (vaginal, anal or oral)
- Latex condoms prevent the passage of semen into the vagina, rectum or mouth.
- A new condom must be used each and every time a couple engages in sexual activity where there may be an exchange of sexual fluids.
- Condoms must not be reused.
- Condoms deteriorate over time and particularly when they are exposed to heat. if they are carried or stored for a long period of time, they should be replaced.
- There may be a possible allergy to the lubricant or spermicide - nonoxynal 9
 but this is rare.

- When used correctly and consistently, latex condoms are very effective, but not 100%.
- Inspect the package for holes and expiration date.
- Choose between lubricated and nonlubricated.
- Make certain that the condom is right side out. (you can check by gently blowing into the tip of the condom until the tip naturally sticks out)
- You may want to put a small amount of waterbased lubricant inside the reservoir tip of the condom to increase sensation.
- Gently pinch the tip of the condom between the tip of your thumb and forefinger of your weaker hand. (creating a reservoir & eliminating any air)



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- Before the erect penis is placed anywhere, roll the condom onto the penis. as you roll it down to the base of the penis (the part closest to your body). press out any air bubbles. You may want to apply more of the water-based lubricant to the outside of the condom to ease insertion. a water based lubricant is recommended because it helps keep the latex condom intact. it is sometimes recommended to use lubricants with the spermicide non-oxynol 9. NOTE: Oil-based lubricants (such as petroleum jelly or butter) break down latex, destroying the condom's effectiveness.
- As soon as ejaculation occurs, hold on to the condom at the base of the penis and carefully remove the condom along with its contents.
- When removing the condom do not spill contents.
- Tie a knot near the opening and dispose with care.

WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS

IF YOU DO BECOME PREGNANT?

If you do become pregnant you can choose:

- 1 Keeping your baby
- 2 Foster care or adoption

3 - Abortion

There is also the issue of the father's responsibilities to you and your baby

- It is imperative that you talk about your
- Options with an adult you trust: preferably your parents, or a close relative, doctor, clergy, teacher or counselor.
- It is not wise to rely only on your friends...they are probably as inexperienced and naive about this very important decision in your life as you are.
- It may be a good idea to also speak to a teen mom ... you can learn first hand what it really means to be a teen parent.

- If you decide to continue your pregnancy, you must remember that you now have to consider the new life growing within you.
- This means that everything you do can affect your baby. (ie. alcohol, smoking, drugs, nutrition, rest, physical activity...)
- That is why prenatal care is so important.
- You should consult a physician as soon as possible about your health and the health of your baby and continue with periodic check-ups. These visits are crucial to the well being of your child and you.
- During pregnancy you should be tested for sexually transmitted diseases, including aids. Nearly 100% of new cases of hiv infection in children result from the virus being passed from an infected mother to her newborn. remember, other stds can harm your baby too.
