Multiple Drug Resistant Organisms: A Growing Concern

All healthcare staff in all healthcare centres are needed to help prevent the spread of new drug resistant organisms.

These organisms are mutations of bacteria that were conquered 50 years ago: they spread easily and don't respond to antibiotics. Because they may be found in asymptomatic people, preventing transmission must be high priority.

Methicillin resistant staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) is one of the most prevalent of these organisms and its incidence is increasing.

Learn how to forestall the spread of MRSA. Also learn about the drug treatment regimen using Vancomycin and about Vancomycin resistant enterococci (VRE).

Tb Or Not Tb: Prevention And Treatment

Fueled by urban crowding, homelessness and drug abuse, TB has surged in a society that thought it was gone for good. Neglected for years, TB is back with strains that are deadlier than before. Between the drug resistant strains and the increase in people infected with HIV/AIDS, there has been a rapid increase in the number of TB cases.

This program presents up to date information on the resurgence of TB, methods of diagnosis, treatment and precautions that need to be taken by health care providers. Multiple drug resistant TB (MDR-TB) has dramatically increased the fatality rates and increased the risk to health care workers. Also included is information on surveillance and vaccination.
