Burns In Children: Homecare For Burns

Teaches, at a basic level for parents and caregivers, about four key issues necessary to the care of the child at home.

Covers infection control and explains how to minimize its risks; specifically explains the importance of cleaning the bathtub before the child uses it, the importance of proper clothing, dressing changes, and wound care.

Describes pressure garments and their purpose. Discusses how exercise and rehabilitation benefit the child and explains the importance of parental involvement.

Details wound care, including the "do's and don'ts" of dressing changes and wound cleansing.

Antidotal Therapies

Poison control specialists Dr. Steven Marcus and Nurse Lois Honcharuk discuss various antidotal treatments including narcan, cyanide kits, E.D.T.A., and glucagon, Dr. Marcus explores the complications related to each antidote and pays special attention to the treatment of combined carbon monoxide overloading and cyanide poisoning. The panelists also describe the most effective nursing treatment modes for acute cases, and they weigh the advantages and disadvantages of mucomist and fisostygm. 27 minutes, order 1-3714

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Lead Poisoning

Lead poisoning poses serious developmental risks to children. Poison control specialists discuss the diagnosis and treatment of children with lead poisoning and explain why successful management of this problem is dependent on a strong doctor/patient/parent relationship. Nutritional counselling, a key component of lead reduction therapy, is also explored and special attention paid to strategies that increase a child's calcium, iron and zinc levels.

Rationale for Stomach Emptying

Prompt gastric emptying is often the best remedy for the ingestion of poison. Poison control specialist Dr. Stephen Marcus discusses two primary modes for inducing emptying: Forced emesis and gastric lavage. Dr. Marcus sites various studies that examine the efficacy of forced emesis and stresses that home use of Syrup of Ipecac is the most effective early treatment method. Marcus' lecture also includes a presentation of various lavage tubes that can be used to achieve emptying.
